Removing EXIF Data From Competition Images

At camera clubs in Cornwall it seems that the prints and DPIs for competitions are sent to the judge two weeks before the actual results are announced by the same judge at the competition evening.

I choose to anonymise all the DPIs submitted for all of the Cornwall Photographic Alliance competitions, therefore if the judge loads the images into Adobe Bridge they will not see any EXIF data which has been recorded by the camera and any additional information that would have been added when importing the images into the computer.

Procedure:

Load the image into Photoshop

Go to Image \rightarrow Select All (PC: Ctrl+A) (Mac: Command+A)

Go to Edit \rightarrow Copy (Ctrl+C) (Mac: Command+C)

Go to File \rightarrow New see image below, Clipboard is highlighted. Click on Create.

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Let's start something new. Start with your own document settings, pre-formatted document presets or explore some of our helpful templates and starter files. Height Orientation Artbox						rds
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A blank document window will open in Photoshop.

Then go to Edit \rightarrow Paste (PC: Ctrl+V) (Mac Command+V)

The new window will be filled with the original image.

Next flatten the image.

Go to Layer \rightarrow Flatten Image

Save the file with an appropriate name.

Look at the properties in Adobe Bridge and they will be blank.
